To engage the community in our vision for a more inclusive community, the Blue Skies Team has invited people to participate in conversations on 3 December 2009, by either:

- participating in a scheduled conversation (please see www.blue-skies.info for the conversation schedule); or
- by hosting your own conversation.

Introduction

If the Blue Skies vision inspires you (or even a part of it) and you would like to be part of turning vision into reality, you may like to host your own conversation.

You could invite others who share your passion and are willing to commit to some action locally, to join you.

This pack includes all you need to:

- register your conversation;
- · invite people to your conversation; and
- feed back the outcomes of your conversation to be included on the Blue Skies website (www.blue-skies.info).



Conversation hosts may choose to use the three questions offered from the Blue Skies Team:

- 1. What would it take to create an inclusive community?
- 2. What are the elements of an inclusive community already happening here?
- 3. What action am I willing to take to progress the vision?

Alternatively, you may like to develop your own conversation question that if explored, would give a deeper understanding of the issue and open a path for action (please find some examples on page 6).

Either way, please feel free to refer people to the Blue Skies Scenario document and the companion document — the Blue Skies Principles, before you start your conversation.

Tips for hosting a conversation

Remember; the knowledge and wisdom you need is already in the group.

Your role is to:

- invite people into the conversation with a question that has meaning for the group;
- make sure that everyone participating in the conversation has seen the Blue Skies Scenario and Principles;
- make sure the environment is comfortable;
- keep attention focused on the question;
- make sure everyone is heard — listened to with respect and curiosity;
- capture the key messages and actions;
- arrange to meet again if the group would like to;
- send feedback from the conversation to Blue Skies; and
- ensure conversation participants know the Blue Skies website address (www.blue-skies.info) so they can see the outcomes from around the state and the next steps.





Having a powerful question

A good question focuses on what is meaningful for the group; it triggers our curiosity; and invites us to explore further. A good question brings good ideas and possibilities to the surface, but doesn't necessarily solve problems immediately.

Ask "what's possible" not "who is to blame". Keep asking.



How to capture the key messages

A feedback form has been provided to capture the key messages and send them to the Blue Skies website. However, your group may also like to draw, audiotape, or capture the conversation in some other way as well.

What does it take to keep people safe, without limiting their choices?

How do we support the shift from deficit-based assessment to strength-based assessment of people with disability?

How can we make better use of people's gifts and talents in developing a more inclusive community?

What does local government do now towards building a more inclusive community and what would it take to do more?
